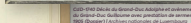

Postcard of Hohenbourg Castle, located in Lengries, Upper Bavaria, which was acquired by Duke Adolph of Nassau, later Grand Duke of Luxembourg, and which remained the family's summer residence until the mid-20th century. It was in this Castle that the delegation of the Chamber of Deputies went to collect the oath of Grand Duke William IV.



Charles Crolius

In accordance with article 5 of the Constitution in force at the time, the Grand Duke took the oath of office "in the presence of the Chamber of Deputies or a delegation appointed by it". The delegation was drawn by lot during a plenary session, and thus the deputies Mr. Auguste Laval (President), Messrs. Charles Crocius, Emile Prüm, Robert Brasseur and Luc Housse, went to receive the oath of office from Grand Duke William IV on 22 November 1905 at Hohenbourg Castle.
